LaHAIR NAMED PCL MVP: 1B **Bryan LaHair** became the second player in Iowa Cubs history to win the Pacific Coast League MVP after batting .331 with 38 home runs and 109 RBI in 129 games for the I-Cubs this year. **Geovany Soto** also won the award in 2007. LaHair's 38 home runs set a new Iowa franchise record and won him the Joe Bauman Award for the most home runs in all of minor league baseball. LaHair also led the PCL in slugging (.664), OPS (1.070), extra-base hits (78), total bases (303), home run per at-bat ratio (1/12.00), and intentional walks (9). He tied for the league lead in RBI, was fourth in doubles (38), and tied for fifth in batting and runs scored (91). LaHair was named the to the PCL All-Star team at mid-season and participated in the home run derby. He was also named the team MVP and to the all-PCL team before getting called up to Chicago on September 2.

OUR NEXT 30 YEARS: The 30th season of Iowa Cubs baseball finished better than it started. After reaching a season-low 17 games under .500 on August 2, the team went 19-13 over the final 32 games to finish 66-77. The Cubs finished with a losing record and in last place in PCL's American Northern Division standings for the first time since 2005. This was the organization's 30th season as the Iowa Cubs and the 31st season as the Triple-A affiliate of the Chicago Cubs. The team was known as the Iowa Oaks during the 1981 season. This was the 43rd season of Triple-A baseball in Des Moines and the 14th season as a member of the Pacific Coast League.

NOT MUCH DRAMA: Playoff races were locked up early this year as only five of the 16 teams in the PCL finished with winning records this season. Memphis (77-66) was the only non-division winner to finish above .500. Last year, 10 of 16 teams finished with a winning record, including all four clubs in the Cubs' American Northern Division. Since the Cubs joined the PCL in 1998, this is the fewest number of teams to post a winning record for the year.

FORTY IS SPORTY: The Cubs won three of their final four home games to finish 40-31 at Principal Park this year. The Cubs have won at least 40 home games in five of the last six seasons. The only miss was a 39-33 mark in 2010. The Cubs have not had a losing home record since finishing 33-39 in 2000.

A NEW ERA: The Cubs' pitching staff finished 10th in the league with a 5.52 ERA. That is a new franchise record for the highest team ERA in a season. The old mark was 5.37, set in 1987 and matched in 2000. The team also set a franchise record with 759 earned runs allowed. The old mark was 741 during the 2000 season. The staff allowed double digit runs in a game more times this year (23) than any other season since joining the PCL in 1998. A total of 33 different pitchers made an appearance for the Cubs this year and 15 different pitchers made at least one start. The team posted a league-high 7.27 ERA in May, but also finished second with a 3.99 mark in July. The team ERA was 6.90 through the first 72 games of the season and 4.18 over the final 71.

NEED A LITTLE PATIENCE: The Cubs finished last in the PCL with 439 walks on offense. Reno led the league with 643. The Cubs were ninth in the league in batting (.284) and 11th in runs scored (750), but were 14th in on-base percentage (.345). Only New Orleans (.343) and Oklahoma City (.341) had a lower mark, but their team batting averages were .273 and .260 respectively. The Cubs were efficient with their scoring opportunities. The Cubs had a league-low 986 men left on base for the year. Omaha and Salt Lake were tied ahead of the Cubs with 1007.

GOOD HANDS TEAM: The Cubs tied a franchise record for the fewest errors in a season with 97. That ties the mark set last season when the Cubs committed fewer than 100 errors for the first time in franchise history. This year's team finished just shy of matching last year's record for fielding percentage. This year, the Cubs finished at .981 after posting a .982 mark last year. Only Salt Lake (92) committed fewer errors than the Cubs this season. The Cubs were third in fielding percentage behind Salt Lake (.983) and Reno (.982).

HALF-MILLION FAN MARCH: The Cubs finished fourth in the league for both total and average attendance this season. The Cubs drew 500,675 fans to Principal Park over 69 home dates for an average of 7,256 per game. Three dates were lost to rain. This is the third straight season, and the eighth time in the last 10 years, that the Cubs have reached the 500,000 milestone for paid attendance. Since the team's new stadium was built in 1992, the club has averaged over 480,000 fans per season. The team is 5,841 fans away from reaching 14 million in total attendance since Triple-A baseball came to Des Moines in 1969.

DON'T GET FANCY, JUST GET DANCY: Cubs manager **Bill Dancy** entered the season ranked third among active minor league managers with 1,604 career wins. He still ranks third, but has tightened the race with the two men ahead of him. Tom Kotchman of short-season Orem began the year with 1,632 and Dave Huppert of Lakeland was second with 1,609.

DOUBLE DIPPING: The Cubs tied a franchise record with 10 doubles in a game on August 23 against Oklahoma City. The original record was also set against Oklahoma City on August 8, 1997 in an American Association game. **Bryan LaHair** had four doubles to tie the Iowa single-game record set by **Jake Fox** on May 2, 2008 at Sacramento.

ALTITUDE SICKNESS: The Cubs tied a franchise record by allowing 19 earned runs in a 19-9 loss at Colorado Springs on May 23. It was a single-game high in a PCL game as the old record was set on May 13, 1987 against Oklahoma City in an American Association game. **Robert Coello** was the starting pitcher against the Sky Sox and allowed 12 runs on 11 hits, including five home runs, in five innings. Five home runs allowed tied also tied a franchise record. **Dave Swartzbaugh** allowed five home runs in a game against Omaha on July 27, 1996.

THE BULLPEN STRIKES BACK: The Cubs tied a franchise record with 19 strikeouts in a 15-inning game on June 27 against Albuquerque. Starter **Jay Jackson** struck out five over six innings, but it was **Scott Maine** and **John Gaub** that came up big in relief. Maine started the ninth inning and struck out a career-high seven over three innings of work. Gaub picked up in the 12th inning and struck out a career-high seven over the final four innings. Gaub got the win in the Cubs' 6-5 victory. The Cubs also struck out 19 in a game on June 27, 2004 against Tucson in a nine-inning game. Starter **Sergio Mitre** struck out 13 over six innings. **Will Ohman** fanned four in an inning and two-thirds while **Francis Beltran** struck out two in his inning. The Cubs lost that game 3-2.

AT A LOSS: **Jay Jackson** led the team and the league with 14 losses this season. He is the first Cubs' pitcher to lead the PCL in losses since **Phil Norton** lost 13 games in 2000. Jackson ranks third on the franchise list for losses in a season. **Bill Earley** lost 16 games in 1982 and **Chris Forsythe** suffered 15 losses in 1972.

LEAVING A LEGACY: After starting the season 2-4 with a 9.07 ERA in nine starts, the Chicago Cubs released LHP **J.R. Mathes** on May 27. Over the last five seasons, Mathes was 42-33 with a 5.05 ERA in 112 games (102 starts). He is Iowa's all-time wins leader and is second in career starts behind 105 by **Kennie Steenstra** (1993-98). He ranks third in career innings pitched (591.1) and is fourth in losses.

HOME RUN CHAMP: For winning the Joe Bauman Trophy as the minor league home run champ, **Bryan LaHair** will receive a check for \$7,600 (\$200 per homer) at the Awards Luncheon at the Baseball Winter Meetings in Dallas in December. Iowa-based Musco Lighting sponsors the Joe Bauman Award. The Joe Bauman Award began in 2002 after Joe Bauman's record for most home runs in a professional season (72) was passed by Barry Bonds in 2001. Bauman set the record with Roswell, NM in 1954. LaHair is the seventh winner in 10 years of the award to play at least part of his season in the PCL.

LEADING BY EXAMPLE: In addition to leading the league in home runs, **Bryan LaHair** also led the league in slugging percentage (.664), total bases (303), extra-base hits (76), and intentional walks (9) while tying for the league lead in RBI (109). **Brooks Kieschnick** (1995) was the last Cubs' player to lead the league in homers (23), total bases (250), and extra-base hits (94). **Geovany Soto** led the league in RBI (109) and slugging (.652) in 2007.

RANK AND FILE: **Bryan LaHair's** season totals rank among the best in Iowa history in several categories. In addition to setting a new single-season home run record, LaHair ranks second in total bases in a year. **Mel Hall** had 307 in 1982. He is tied for third with 38 doubles and tied for fourth in RBI. His 63 home runs over the last two seasons also rank tied for fifth with **Robin Jennings** (1996-99) on Iowa's career list.

CUBS SAY SAYONARA TO SCALES: The Cubs' career of **Bobby Scales** came to a quick stop on June 27 when he signed with the Nippon Ham Fighters of Japan. Scales was on pace for a career year, batting .304 with nine home runs, 43 RBI, 22 doubles, and a team-high 47 walks in 68 games before he signed. Scales began his Iowa career in 2008 and hit a home run in his first at-bat as a pinch-hitter. Over the last four seasons, he hit .292 with 39 home runs and 194 RBI in 399 games with Iowa. He ranks third on the franchise list with 251 runs scored and is tied for fifth with 90 doubles.

TURN THREE: **Scott Moore** lined into a triple play on June 3 at Nashville. It was the first triple play turned against the Cubs since August 7, 1989 against Denver.

ON THE MEND: Chicago assigned seven players to rehab assignments with Iowa this season. **Jeff Baker, Darwin Barney, Marlon Byrd, Reed Johnson, Alfonso Soriano, Andrew Cashner, and Randy Wells** combined to play in 20 games with Iowa this year.

ANSWERING THE CALL: Not counting the players on rehab assignments, the Chicago Cubs called up 16 different players from Iowa at various points during the season. **Chris Carpenter** and **Steve Clevenger** were called up to Chicago from double-A Tennessee after spending time with Iowa during the season. Carpenter was called up in June while Clevenger was called up after the double-A playoffs. **D.J. LeMahieu** also made his big league debut straight from double-A before joining Iowa for the first time on June 28. LeMahieu was recalled to Chicago as a September call-up. The call-ups from Iowa were: **Tony Campana, Welington Castillo, Tyler Colvin, Bryan LaHair, D.J. LeMahieu, Lou Montanez, Brad Snyder, Justin Berg, Casey Coleman, Doug Davis, John Gaub, Scott Maine, Marcos Mateo, Ramon Ortiz, and Jeff Stevens.** Campana, Clevenger, LeMahieu, and Gaub were the four to make their major league debuts this season.

ROSTER RUMBLINGS: This year's club had 61 different players appear in a game and, following September call-ups, the Cubs finished the season with 130 player transactions. That is a jump from 49 players and 104 transactions last season. Over the last five seasons, the highs were 62 players and 160 transactions in 2007.

PDC EXTENDED: The Chicago Cubs and Iowa Cubs extended their player development contract through the 2016 season. The 2016 season will be the 36th year of affiliation between the two organizations.

MAJOR MILESTONE: The Cubs' 3-2 victory over Fresno on August 6 was the organization's 3,000th victory since Triple-A baseball came to Des Moines in 1969. According to the PCL record book, Iowa joins Oklahoma City, Sacramento, Salt Lake, and Tacoma as the league's only current franchise to have reached 3,000 wins in their history. In the 43 seasons of triple-A baseball in Des Moines, the franchise's record is 3,016-3,045. In 14 seasons, the Cubs are 1,032-969 all-time in PCL play (all records reflect regular season games only).

BEAT THE STREAK: The Cubs won a season-high seven straight games from June 22-28. It was the team's longest winning streak since winning seven straight August 12-18, 2008 in a long series against New Orleans.
